The 100 Black Men of Phoenix ("The 100") is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization created in 1988 that comprises 114 professional African American men. The 100 is one of national chapters of the 100 Black Men of America national organization, which was founded in New York City in 1967. The national organization consists of 10,000 members that mentor over 125,000 underserved, underrepresented minority youth annually.

MISSION

The 100 Black Men of Phoenix is dedicated to improving the quality of life of African Americans within the Phoenix, AZ metro area by enhancing educational and economic opportunities for all. We take an active leadership role in helping minority youth become contributing, competitive and valued members of society.

Our motto, "what they see is what they'll be" refers to a "lead by example" approach that resonates with our youth who often lack the exposure or positive behavior modeling from caring and successful African American men.

THE MEN OF TOMORROW ACADEMY (M.O.T.A.)

The mission of the Men of Tomorrow Academy is twofold. Its primary function is to facilitate learning, growth and fellowship opportunities for our mentees. Secondly, M.O.T.A. presents a unique opportunity for members of the 100 Black Men of Phoenix to participate in a group mentoring setting and for youth to take advantage of the opportunity.



THE MENTORSHIP EDUCATION NETWORK (M.E.N.)

The 100 Black Men of Phoenix Mentorship Education Network focuses on the positive self-empowerment of African American and Hispanic adolescent males. The program consists of monthly field trips with 7th and 8th graders from the Roosevelt School District, who we have had over a 20-year partnership with. Areas of self-improvement include but not limited to academic, career development, social and emotional skill development, and culture competency. The Program includes African American males, who are members of the 100 Black Men, that wish to serve as positive role models and mentors to young males. Young males are engaged in one-on-one and/or group mentoring sessions and structured lectures designed to teach youth about the social factors that negatively and positively impact their development.
